## **Note from the Director**

As we enter into a new season of ministry with camps and seasonal retreats, our theme this summer is 'Abide.' We'll be focusing on John 15. Christ is the ultimate teacher, and His ability to illustrate truth is without comparison. The night before His crucifixion He is instructing His disciples in the reality of what it is to be a true follower of His. Hours before His death, He tells His disciples "I Am the True Vine." This is the last of

the seven "I Am" statements found in the book of John. We will be studying three things true of followers of Jesus Christ that we find in John 15. They bear fruit, they abide (or remain) in Christ's love, and they keep His commandments. To abide describes something that remains where it is - continues or endures. To abide in Christ is to maintain unbroken communion with Him. Jesus' plea is for false followers to repent and express true faith in Him. It also was an encouragement to true believers to abide in Him fully. I believe that abiding is a position of true followers of Christ, but we must also learn to lean into this reality. So, what does abiding look like in our daily lives?

Abiding in Christ is more than just spiritual disciplines, but it's not less than that, either. I believe an aspect of abiding is "ordering" our life around Christ. How often do we think to consult him before building our to-do lists or in the transitions of our day? Do we ask Him for wisdom as we approach our relationships? Abiding in Christ is trusting Him to meet all needs and be our treasure. Abiding should also produce "fruit" in our lives, like love, joy, peace, patience, etc. We all want to see fruit, but only abiding in Christ can produce the genuine fruit that is pleasing to the Lord. Sometimes this lack of fruit is the revealing of the health of our relationship with Him. It's not a self-manufactured fruit, but instead, the result of abiding.

Recently I've been walking through some health challenges, and though my body isn't able to do the things that I'd like it to do, my spirit is still very active. Sometimes this is felt in restlessness or anxiousness, but at other times God reminds me to abide in Him for my strength and peace in the midst of the pain. So in those times of unease, these are some of the ways we can abide:

Abide in My Word - "Jesus said to the Jews who had believed him, 'If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples'." (John 8:31) Abide in My Love - "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love..." (John 15:9) Abide in Me - "Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me." (John 15:4)

The command to 'abide in Me' is more than a daily meeting each morning, then off to the races. It is a continual living in His presence. As I consider this call, I am comforted by what I know of God in His word; His faithfulness, His love, His mercy, and the assurance that He never changes. He is love. He is light. He is good.

## **Progress Report**

#### **New Land and Home Project**

Have you heard the news? In November we took a loan to purchase 94 acres and a farmhouse that bordered Miracle Mountain Ranch. *After only 2 months*, we were able to pay off this 15-year loan for \$223,000! We are so thankful for the support of those who chose to help the ministry in this unique opportunity.

The next part of this project is to raise enough funding to rebuild the farmhouse on the new property so that it can be used as a staff home. We estimate that it will cost \$115,000 to fix up the house and improve access to the property. We invite you to help us finish up this project!

#### **Warren Gives**

Warren Gives is a unique event where our county helps raise awareness for nonprofits and provides a partial match on donations given throughout the event. Every qualifying donation up to \$1,000 is partially matched, so your donations on this day go further! They also cover all credit card fees if you give online during the event. The money raised this year will go towards Fort Wilderness and the Scholarship Fund.

This spring, we are turning back to a project we started a couple of years agorebuilding Fort Wilderness. An accidental fire burned down the Fort 4 years ago. We received donations and insurance money to rebuild. We have \$42,000 in that fund, but we'll need to raise about \$60,000 more to finish the project. The Fort will have two bunkhouses for camping, a picnic area, an outdoor kitchen area, and a campfire area for kids to enjoy.

During the summer, kids can choose to upgrade their camp to include a memorable overnight experience at the fort after they ride out on horseback or hay wagon. We also host retreats like our Father-Son and others from this outpost location. Consider donating on this day to send families and youth to camp and finish the Fort Wilderness project. ## **Glimpse Into Our Lives**

We get a lot of questions about being on staff here at Miracle Mountain Ranch. We recognize that we are a very unique organization and are so blessed by an incredible staff team! Here are just a few fun facts:

Currently there are 69 "staff" at the Ranch. This, of course, includes all of the staff children. We have 15 couples and 8 singles serving year-round with us. Everyone is housed on Ranch property and the Ranch's general fund helps cover the cost of housing and utilities for our full-time staff. A few of the jobs at MMR are: Receptionists, Secretaries, Finances and Bookkeeping, Marketing and Media, Operations, Maintenance and Groundskeeping, Farming, Horse Department and Barn Maintenance, Food Service, Housekeeping, Guest Services, Construction, School of Discipleship Faculty, Programming and Camp Management, Nursing, and all of other jobs that fall under these departments. Many of these departments will also take on more staff through our summer season in a variety of paid and volunteer positions.

We often marvel at the team that God has built here and the sweet fellowship that we enjoy. As with any body, there are times of conflict, but we rejoice that God continues to walk us through resolve as well. We are blessed by a team of people that technically don't get "paid" for their work. Every staff member is on mission support and has a team of supporters that helps them cover their costs of living and essentials. These are often families and friends, as well as churches and sometimes organizations.

Many of the staff serve as instructors in our School of Discipleship (S.O.D.) program. Each staff member also works in an advisory role with our S.O.D. students. The students visit their assigned staff houses weekly for time with their advisors, but it's also very common for a group of students to spend time with staff for game or movie nights, or to just talk with them about things they are wrestling with. We are humbled to be a part of their lives and walk alongside them. This model of "life-on-life discipleship" is what drew my own heart to the ministry over 30 years ago, and I find myself blessed to benefit from the challenge and accountability that mentoring can bring so many years later.

Our most recent change on staff is the marriage of Josh Snyder and Rachel Rothey. Josh had recently joined us on programming staff and Rachel was serving in the operations department. They were married on October 21, 2023.

Thank you to everyone who is a part of supporting our staff team. Without your generosity it would be impossible for our staff to serve here and for the Ranch to minister in the capacity that we do. You are a vital part of God's work here and we are grateful for you!

It has become somewhat of a practice of mine recently to slow down, to pause, just for a moment, before entering prayer. I think there have been times at the start of class when the students have thought I've fallen asleep! But I have become persuaded that each of us, in the rush and busyness of life, must take care not to let routine be emptied of meaning. And it seems to me that



discipleship must acknowledge this tension. We must learn the forms and patterns of life (how to ride, how to weld, how to lead, how to read the Bible, etc.), but we must not allow those forms to lose their significance. Our students find themselves wrestling with this now. Over the last months they have continued to grow in competence and skill; however, without care, without reflection, without godly intentionality and watchfulness, they could also grow in boredom and complacency. Happily, the testimonies that our students share from

month to month show evidence of their zeal to grow in spirit as well as in their knowledge and skill. I'm very proud of these students for how they have wrestled this year with the demands that the Lord has placed on them as budding leaders within the church and the world. In a



few short months, that growth will be tested during summer camp.



Please pray for our students this spring - that their progress in training would be matched by a sincere faith and eagerness for what the Lord is doing among them; and pray that our students (and our staff!) would remember, in the busyness of the coming months, to pause and to pray.



## **In Training Program**

MMR's In-Training program is designed as a discipleship model to instruct young men and women in areas of Christ-like character, integrity, and maturity with practical training and experience in a variety of areas within the summer camp setting. In-Trainings are given assignments geared toward personal reflection in light of Scriptural truth, partnered with life application. Assignments are supplemented by one-on-one mentoring from qualified staff who are committed to speak into the teens' lives with truth and love.
