September and October were largely taken up by teaching. I taught a quick introductory class for Bible Hermeneutics in September, which was a joy. One of my students came up to me after the last day of class and told me she had fallen in love with Scripture for the first time during class. It reminds me of Isaiah 55:11-12- "So shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for

which I sent it. For you shall go out in joy and be led forth in peace." The Word of God shall accomplish that for which it was sent—joy and peace in God's people.

After the Hermeneutics class I taught an introductory doctrine class. I could not have had better students or better subject matter. At the end of most classes I felt as though I had just led a worship service rather than a lecture. Again, the students and I were blessed to be able to learn and meditate on the character and work of God in Scripture and in our lives.

In the upcoming months I'll be very busy. In addition to the work of maintaining our licensing and working with our students, I am developing a new class we hope to teach this upcoming spring. I'll also be partnering with a local Christian school to teach their high school Bible class starting next January. There is much to do, so please pray for me, and for the ministry.
