Dear friends and family,

What a great start to 2024 the last few months have been! Our winter retreat season was a wonderful time of fellowship and connecting with everyone who attended. We had our youth winter blast and Servant Attitude Leadership Training (SALT) retreat in January. Youth Winter Blast was a fun few days of tubing, games, and chapels, while in our SALT retreat, the high schoolers who came were able to get an overview of what daily life in the School of Discipleship looks like. In February, we had our men's and couple's retreats, which were refreshing times of getting together with friends and family to have fun and get reminded through worship and chapels of how powerful God's Word is and how it is to be applied to every area of life.

In February, I went with several staff and students to

The CCCA conference is a three-day event that includes workshops on topics beneficial to camp ministry, chapels, and time to connect with other camps. After attending this conference for the past four years, I have decided to join the CCCA Allegheny Section Cabinet, which will involve me in planning future conferences. I'm excited about this opportunity to work alongside other great camp people!

The students in the School of Discipleship are having a great year so far! They are learning more about God and His Word through the various classes they take, and they are all growing in their area of focus for the year and making a significant impact by helping with the retreats that MMR has throughout the year. As an advisor in the School of Discipleship, I help mentor and grade homework for two of the guy students in the program alongside another staff family. Aaron is working in media, learning to take and edit photos and videos,



and Kenton is in the operations department, working on all kinds of vehicles and helping with construction. I have enjoyed getting to know these guys more through weekly advisor nights with the Stanleys!
