### Note from the Director

Our theme for the upcoming season is "Draw Near." We'll be focusing on Hebrews 10:19-25. "Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let

us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the day drawing near."

There are so many wonderful truths found in this passage. I love this phrase "hold fast". It's a beautiful picture of clinging tightly to something with a passion of not letting go. But it doesn't just mean to cling to it, but also to stand on it. We hear the term "hold the line" in war documentaries, or "hold firm" and stand your ground. It is not just grabbing ahold of that promise, but then of making it your ground to stand on.

There are many promises given to us in scripture to hold fast to, but the one we claim here is that of our eternal hope in Christ Jesus and the promise of eternal life with Him because of His righteousness, not our own. There is one requirement that He possesses that enables us to do this. It is HIS faithfulness, not our own. God is the ultimate promise keeper.

Paul also gives further instruction that we are to consider or study each other so we might effectively stir up each other regarding love and good works. We not only need encouragement to be loving and do good works towards others, but also to meet together. We need the fellowship of the body! And the need will INCREASE, not decrease, as His coming grows closer. We live in a world that allows us to neglect fellowship with others in place of short texts, social media interactions, online church services, and "virtual" everything! Do we deliberately engage with others enough to even have the opportunity to "stir" them and be stirred ourselves?

I was looking recently at the final words of Joseph who, in Genesis 50, reminded the Israelites of God's promises at the time of his death. While he knew he wasn't going to see it with his own eyes, he still believed that one day God would take them up and restore them to the Promised Land. The promise of God through Joseph is that God would come and take them up. This is the promise that Jesus gives to those that follow him. John 6:40 says "And this is the will of Him who sent Me, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have everlasting life; and I will raise him up at the last day."

It's easy to walk through the daily trials of life and be bogged down by the myriad of tasks that bombard us. It's easy to look down at the next step and forget that we walk with a great promise ahead of us. We pray that as a ministry, we will faithfully teach others about our great God, that we will stir others up to remember and encourage them to keep walking in faithfulness and draw near to Christ. What a blessing to introduce folks to the faithful God who always keeps His promises. He will take us up!



### **Progress Report**

#### **Staff Home Renovation**

We have been focusing on renovating a former staff house that has been vacant for the past year. We have been updating the kitchen, plumbing, and other areas that needed fixing after a water line break and doing some work on the house's exterior. This project is nearly finished, and the house is almost ready for a new staff family to move in.

#### Town Hall Kitchen

We have been working on medium-sized projects on the Ranch during the winter. The office staff have been renovating the kitchen/meeting area in the town hall by removing the cabinets, painting, and updating the floor, all of which will make this space a better meeting place.

#### **Fort Wilderness**

Last fall, we started on the second turret of Fort Wilderness, but we did not have time to finish before the weather changed. We are back at it and hope to get the frame up soon. Our goal is to have this second turret ready for use during the summer.

#### **New Staff Home**

Our next big project is a full renovation & remodel of a new staff home. You probably remember that we purchased 90 acres and a farmhouse last year. God supplied us with enough to pay off the mortgage, and we have raised enough money to start renovating the house. This will be a big project because the house is in need of significant work. So far, we have been fundraising, assessing the needs, and cleaning it out. We plan to start the renovation side of the project soon. We still need to raise approximately \$30,000 for this project, and we would welcome volunteer construction crews.

#### **Playground Project**

We are moving the playground from behind the Ox Yoke to behind the Brokenstraw. We envision this being a much more interactive and expansive play area for families and youth to enjoy (see model below). ## SCHOOL OF DISCIPLESHIP

Do you ever get the feeling, with the coming of spring each year, that the world is waking up from sleep? It often seems to me, for whatever reason, that I'm waking and thawing with the spring too. Perhaps it's the shot of vitamin D to the system that creates this sensation of waking, but whatever it is, my students experience it too. All winter, they've been working hard in their schooling and areas of focus, they've been leaning into relationships in the dorm, and doing the hard



wrestling with the claims of the gospel necessary to change and grow. Now, we're seeing the fruit of so much of that winter struggle. Things are beginning to click for them, their relationships are deepening, and they're seeing the payoff in their own lives of the work they've put in.

It seems to me that this is simply the pattern of Christian life. Life, death, and new life is not just the course of the seasons, but reflects the turning of the heart of the man or woman in Christ as well. How not to be haughty when we feel spiritual vigor, and how not to fall into sin or despair when we are spiritually dry—these are lessons every Christian must learn.

It's good for our students to learn these lessons now, and to be served by them for the remainder of their lives and ministry. It's good for some of us who are older, as well, to see as we walk with our students; they often impress upon us again the importance of lessons learned and forgotten.



There are only a few months left in the academic year, followed by the summer season where our students will take positions of leadership on our summer team. Please pray for our students as they complete their studies,



that they will persevere. Pray also for us as we look ahead to the 2025-2026 year, and ask that the Lord will send us a full class!
