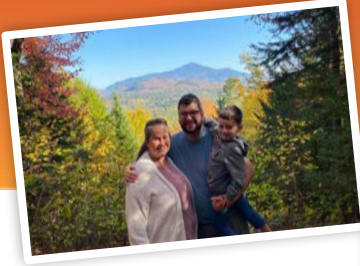


# From the Stanleys
